

The Mayor had the following to report for May, 2021. The police had 124 calls in May, they were 19 traffic citations, 18 non-traffic citations, 12 assisting other departments and 12 calls assisting E.M.S., the balance of the calls were for various reasons such as animal complaints, disabled vehicle, disturbance, etc. The Mayor also reported the mileage on the 2013 Ford Taurus was 248 and no expenses, the mileage on the 2017 Ford Explorer was 1,505 and expenses were \$228.55, mileage on the 2019 Ford Explorer was 1,528 and no expenses.

He also said there's been several calls regarding animals running at large and asked for everyone with animals to please obey the ordinances regarding animals. He said Chief Petruski has also posted Nixel with the information.

SOLICITORS REPORT: Solicitor Patricia McGrail asked if Council had any questions regarding the public hearings this evening. She suggested moving forward on 1124 Burbank Road, regarding the testimony from Mr. Lewellen 1816 Tacoma Avenue while they are working through their attorney there are several maintenance issues with no immediate plans. and 1820 Tacoma Avenue is a high priority. She said her recommendation is move forward with 1124 Burbank Avenue, 1816 Tacoma and 1820 Tacoma Avenue.

COMMITTEE REPORTS:

CHAIRMAN OF SANITATION: Mr. Betters gave the April Keystone garbage report. The collections for April were \$20,178.00 and the delinquents were \$5,517.93. The report for May was not available for meeting time. He also commented on the two new hires for the public works department are working out great, both are good workers. He said he borrowed a set of bleachers from PVAA to put down at Romine Field until our order comes in.

He also said there was a recovery mission with the new rescue boat and he was the first one to captain it. All of the firemen were in training. It wasn't a pleasant scene. He stated they located the body and the divers from Monroeville pulled the body out. Hopefully, there won't be any more of these but they located the body within 20 minutes. He thanked everyone involved in the rescue and how they worked together.

He then welcomed back the seniors they will be meeting in the social hall next week. He then gave the report for the property chairman Doug Junecko: He announced we were denied the Blight Grant through the state, however we still have the Act 152 Blight grant that is pending. He reported good news with CDBG 47 we applied for and are receiving two demolitions 1483 Romine Avenue and 1726 Romine Avenue Rear along with street reconstruction in the amount of \$73,000.00 for

Joy/Johnson Streets. He thanked everyone for working together to get these grants. He then discussed the tree dedication and sign. He said possibly do this before one of the girls softball games.

She stated we are on track with our finances and are ready to payoff the TAN note in the next day or so. She reported the discount period for the real estate taxes is over and now due at face amount. The May tax collection report is delayed due to busy collections.

Manager Migliori gave report for the month of May.




MOTION: Mr. Hresko moved, seconded by Mr. Better, "Motion to adjourn."
